







<p>All you need to know about Youthpass</p> <p>Easy to read and easy to understand</p>	
<p>Youthpass is a document. A document is an important paper with information. You use this document for European Union programs:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • European Solidarity Corps • Erasmus + 	<p>Youthpass</p> 
<p>The European Union is called the EU. The EU is a group of countries that work together. These countries work to help each other and be stronger. The EU makes rules about many parts of our lives. Some of these rules are important for people with disabilities. For example, rules that give people with disabilities more rights when going to another country.</p>	 
<p>The European Solidarity Corps is an international programme for young people. The European Solidarity Corps helps you:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • to be a volunteer in another country • learn new skills • learn about different cultures. <p>Culture is the different ways people live. Like the different food they eat.</p>	 

<p>Erasmus + is an international program for young people. Erasmus + helps you:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • learn new skills in another country • experience different cultures • improve your job opportunities. 	 
<p>In Youthpass you list:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • what you have learned in the project • what skills you have developed. <p>There are 8 important skills in Youthpass. Here you can read about 8 important skills.</p>	
<p>1. What are multi language skills?</p> <p>It means you can communicate in different languages:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • to speak in different languages • to write in different languages. <p>It also means you respect:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • other languages • other cultures. 	 
<p>During the project you meet people from other countries. People in the project communicate in different languages. You can practise speaking other languages.</p>	

You can answer these questions:

- Have you learned any new words in another language?
- Can you write some words in another language?
- Did you speak with people from other countries before the project?
- How did you communicate with people during the project?
- What helped you learn another language?



2. What are personal, social and learning skills?

Personal skills mean you can, for example:

- cope with problems
- take care of your body
- take care of your feelings and be healthy.

Social skills mean you can, for example:

- make friends
- work well with others
- fix problems with other people.

Learning skills means you can, for example:

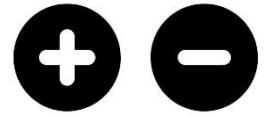
- learn new things
- plan what you want to learn.



During the European project you can decide what you want to learn.

You can also find out:

- what you are good at
- what you need to improve.



You can answer these questions:

- Did you plan what you would learn before the project?
- Did you manage to learn what you planned?
- Did you learn anything you did not expect?
- Did you enjoy working with other people?
- Have you changed?



3. What are citizenship skills?

It means to be a good citizen.

Being a good citizen means:

- Being interested in your country and the world.
- Helping others.
- Caring for the environment.
- Sharing what you think.
- Voting in elections.



During the European projects you can work for:

- people
- environmental protection.

You can also learn about how people live in different European countries.



You can answer these questions:

- Have you learned about how people live in other countries?
- What does being a citizen mean to you?
- What can you do for the people and environment in your community?



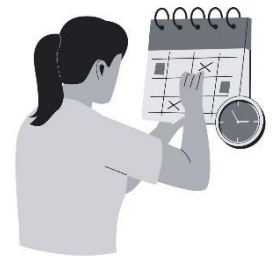
4. What are entrepreneurship skills?

It means you make your ideas happen.

It means helping others.

It means solving problems.

It means planning what to do.



During the European projects you can:

- Improve talents.
- Find new things that you like.
- Try new roles, like being an employee or volunteer.
- Make your ideas happen.



You can answer these questions:

- What talents did you get better at?
- Did you learn anything?
- Did you work with others?
- Did you think of any ideas?
- Did you make your ideas happen?



5. What are cultural awareness skills?

It means you want to try different types of art, for example:

- photography
- music
- painting.

It means making art, for example:

- drawing
- dancing
- making sculptures.

It means being interested in the cultures of different countries.



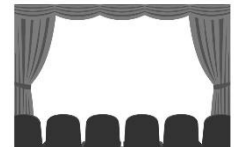
During the European projects you can:

- Learn about different cultures.
- Get better at making art.



You can answer these questions:

- Have you made any art?
- Have you learned about the culture of another country?
- Have you been to cultural events? For example:
 - a festival
 - an exhibition
 - an art workshop
 - a theatre show



6. What are digital skills?

It means you can use computers and technology safely.

Computers and technology are things like:

- computer or tablet
- smartphone
- internet
- apps
- Facebook.



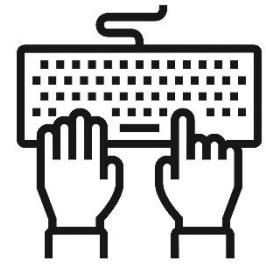
During the European projects you can:

- learn to use computer and technology
- make videos
- make Facebook posts.



You can answer these questions:

- Did you use the internet during the project?
- Did you search for information online?
- Did you make posts on Facebook or Instagram?
- Did you use Messenger or WhatsApp?
- Did you use a computer?

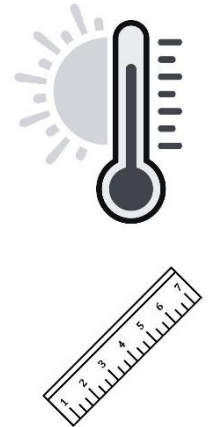


7. What are mathematical skills?

It means you can:

- count money
- measure food ingredients or temperature.
- solve everyday problems
- Use different tools like a scale or ruler.

You use math skills every day.



During the European projects you can improve math skills.
For example, you can manage money better.



You can answer these questions:

- Did you manage money?
- Did you go shopping?
- Did you cook and measure ingredients?
- Did you use a watch to know the time?
- Did you plan your time?
For example, did you plan what time you wake up?



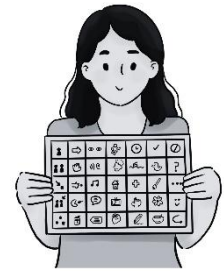
8. What are literacy skills?

It means you can read and write.

It means you can make friends with other people.

It means you can share what you think and feel:

- by speaking
- by writing
- or by using other ways to communicate like using pictures or a tablet.



During European projects you can talk to many people.

You can also write many things, for example:

- a Facebook post
- an invitation
- fill in a form about your experience.



You can answer these questions:

- Did you write anything during the project?
- Did you fill in any forms during the project?
- Who did you talk to?
- Did you talk about your needs or ideas?



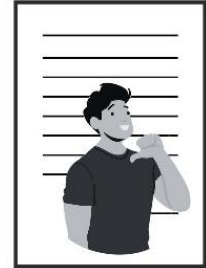
You can put your answers to all questions in the YouthPass certificate.
